

21st Century Community Learning Center

Program Description

The 21st Century Community Learning Center program is a series of year-round before- and after-school activities to improve the academic performance of high school students.

Operated by the Goodwill Industries of Central Indiana, the program combines intensive one-on-one, group and educational experiences with recreation, life skills and character building activities.

Students participate in clubs, workshops and peer activities, complete community service projects and participate in camps and college tours during the spring and summer months.

The program serves students at Indianapolis Metropolitan High School, Arlington Community High School and George Washington Community High School. It also provides adult basic education and training services to the parents of students in the program.

Services

- Tutoring to help students in English and math
- Workshops teach young people how to become effective student leaders, how to manage their finances and how to resolve conflicts
- Youth clubs on etiquette, physical fitness and health, nutritious cooking techniques and more
- Job-training programs to teach students skills they need for employment
- Life skills classes

Curriculum: Youth case managers, education specialists from Goodwill, tutors and other collaborating organizations supervise classroom, computer labs, hands-on activities and community service projects.

When: The 21st Century Community Learning Center program is a year-round program with special spring and summer camps and workshops.

Hours: After-school tutoring is available from 3:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

Cost: There is no cost to students. Advance registration is required. Some eligibility and income guidelines may apply for some job-training and readiness programs.
